



Let's get the word out about pollinators!

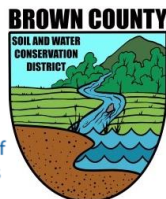
Create a fun, educational poster and have the chance to win a prize and be displayed at the Brown County 4-H Fair!

- Any art media may be used that creates a two-dimensional design (paint, crayon, colored pencil, stickers, paper, etc.).
- The poster must contain the words of this year's theme "**Where Would We BEE Without Pollinators?**" somewhere on the front.
- Poster content should be the original work of the student.
- Each poster should be created by one student.
- The National Association of Conservation Districts (NACD) poster contest entry form must be submitted with the poster. This is the only place the student's name should appear.

Posters and entry forms must be submitted electronically to brown@iaswcd.org no later than 11:59pm on **Monday, May 25th, 2020**. Schools and award recipients will be notified by mid-June 2020.

2020 NACD/BCSWCD Poster Contest Rules

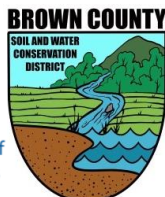
The Brown County SWCD Poster Contest is open to kindergarten through sixth grade students. A first and second place winner will be selected in each of the three categories: K-1st, 2nd-3rd, and 4th-6th. Winners will receive \$50 for first place and \$25 for second place. First place winners will be submitted for state level judging with the possibility of further cash prizes.

- Only digital posters (photographs or scanned copies of the hand drawn posters in a JPEG format) will be accepted. Photographs must be clear and well framed. Any size poster is acceptable.
- Any media may be used, including paint, crayon, colored pencil, charcoal, stickers, paper, or other materials.
- All posters must be created by an individual student. Entry must be contestant's original creation and may not be traced from photographs or other artists' published works.
- The 2020 Stewardship theme **"Where Would We BEE Without Pollinators?"** must be included on the front side of each poster submission. The student's name, however, should not appear on the front of the poster.
- Each poster must be submitted with a NACD entry form. The form can be filled in electronically or handwritten and resubmitted electronically. The form must be completed and signed by a parent or guardian.
- Although younger students will most likely receive help in planning from parents or teachers, NACD/BCSWCD encourages each student to do their own work. Note: *Entries with student handwriting and coloring will score better than those designed, drawn, and colored by adult assistance.*
- To submit posters and entry forms, please save the files as a JPEG (or PDF for the entry form) with the student's name as the file name and send them to brown@iaswcd.org by **11:59pm on Monday, May 25th, 2020.**

Poster Evaluations

Contest entries are reviewed based on the following criteria:

- Conservation message (50 percent) (Poster uses correct theme)
- Visual effectiveness (30 percent)
- Originality (10 percent)
- Universal appeal (10 percent)
